As a former resident of Ross and continuing property owner, I would like to see the fire station restored.

Ross has historically been the most attractive place to live in Marin County, and hence one of the best places to live in the U.S. It is reflected in the great schools, natural resources, and community. The quality of the town's essential services is, of course, foundational to maintaining this dynamic.

When we lived in Ross, my family benefitted from a very fast emergency response from local first responders coming to our home overnight to help with a potential medical issue. I shudder to think how scary (and infuriating) it would have been to wait many minutes longer for emergency services after having abandoned our town's own resources. I remain baffled why our town council would choose to put our residents in this position.

The idea that our town's critical resources should be scaled back was always dubious. I applaud the work of the dedicated local residents who have taken it upon themselves to make sure that this matter - and the analysis behind it - is looked at properly. It is highly concerning (and of course not very surprising) to see that response times have increased dramatically since the station was closed. Ross and its residents deserve better.

We are fortunate that it's not too late to get this fixed - let's do it.
