Dear Mayor, Members of the Council and Town Staff,

I am writing regarding the restoration of the Ross Common field, which is being discussed at the Ross Town Council meeting on Thursday, March 12th.

Respectfully, I would like to remind Ross Town Council and Staff that back at the December council meeting, many residents and organizations in our community expressed their support of full rehabilitation of the Commons. With short notice we were able to secure 235 signatures within 48 hours asking residents to “strongly support renovating and upgrading the field. Our goal is to demonstrate that this project is a true community priority, and that improved turf, grading, drainage, and maintenance would benefit everyone who uses this shared space.” Currently we have 255 signatures with no additional marketing or push for signatures.

Furthermore, several local community organizations have shared that same support and desire for a full rehabilitation. Organizations such as Ross Valley Little League (RVLL), Ross School PTO, RPOA and Ross School. I serve on the RVLL Board that as an organization is not only supportive of a full restoration but also willing to contribute financially. We have over 600 little league players annually from the Ross Valley area and Town of Ross. They all start their little league experience at Ross Commons Park playing baseball, spending time with family and friends and creating lasting memories.

However, the condition of the field has deteriorated drastically. The current grass is uneven, worn, and poses both safety and playability challenges. This limits the ability of our youth to enjoy baseball and other recreational activities safely. It also limits other community events and creates an unsafe environment for our young children and elderly neighbors. Ross Commons plays a central role in our community, serving children, families, Ross School, and local organizations year-round. This is our most cherished public space in Ross, and the Commons deserves the care and attention needed to make it safe, functional, and beautiful again.

Additionally, I want to share relevant information regarding the renovation of the athletic fields at Memorial Park in the Town of San Anselmo that is not only useful, but a sound comparable as the Town of Ross considers the future of the field at Ross Commons.

First, the Ross Town Council and Staff have expressed concern, and shared information on some key areas related a full restoration of Ross Commons. I would like to highlight and address those key areas.

**Dogs** – Dogs are viewed by Town Council and Staff as a major reason the Commons grass turf is currently in such poor, deteriorating condition. It’s also the Town’s concern for creating similar conditions on a post-turf renovation project, should such a project commence. However, **that reasoning was directly refuted** at an in-person meeting I had on December 17, 2025, with **Scott Schneider, Assistant Director of Public Works for the Town of San Anselmo**. Mr. Schneider also served as the project manager for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation.

During that discussion, Mr. Schneider explained that the Town of San Anselmo had retained an expert turf consultant to evaluate the causes of the deterioration of the Memorial Park athletic fields prior to renovation.

According to Mr. Schneider, the consultant's evaluation determined that **dogs and e-bikes were not a cause or contributing factor in the deterioration of the Memorial Park athletic fields**. Instead, the field issues were associated with common factors affecting aging grass athletic fields such as soil conditions, drainage, irrigation performance, and normal wear from athletic use.

It is also worth noting that **dogs continue to be permitted at Memorial Park** today. In fact, San Anselmo Parks and Recreation Commission just recently recommended and unanimously approved extending the allotted time of the daily, off-leash dog rules at Memorial Park.

**E-Bikes** – E-bikes are mentioned and viewed similarly to dogs as a main reason for the current turf conditions. Again, this is **another reason that was directly disputed as mentioned above**. Although E-bikes are not allowed at Memorial Park, they are still driven at and through Memorial Park. However, San Anselmo has not currently stepped up its enforcement with residents or riders by issuing citations to violators of its rules and regulations prohibiting the use of e-bikes. If the newly renovated turf was being damaged or harmed in any, I expect that the Town would quickly take action to mitigate any potential harm and protect its community investment. The fact it hasn't done so would say it's not having the negative effect some may believe.

**Cost** – The estimated costs for a full rehabilitation of the Commons playing fields has been stated to range from \$600,000 up to \$1,000,000+. Again, this information does not align with a recent and very comparable project that our neighbors in San Anselmo recently completed. However, the middle to higher end of this range is significantly more than the cost of that project – Memorial Park Athletics Field Renovation. **Not only did San Anselmo do this same project at the very low end of this range, but it was also for a substantially larger project.**

The grass field at Memorial Park is nearly 2x the size of the Commons (3.2 acres to the Commons 1.9 acres). Memorial Park also has 3 larger baseball fields that were renovated as part of the project. Ross Commons has one smaller baseball field and one much smaller T-Ball field - which both need to be reconfigured and updated. **The cost of the Memorial Park Athletics Field Renovation project, which is very similar in scope and twice the size was \$600K.**

It should be noted that, on April 13, 2021 bids were open for the project and **Marina Landscaping was the low bidder at \$454,360**. Which staff was preparing to recommend that Council award the bid to Marina Landscaping before the project was paused for severe drought conditions at the time. That appears to have changed the project slightly to include rainwater harvesting and thus added an additional \$150,000 to the project. I do not believe rainwater harvesting is needed for the Ross Commons project.

**Timeframe** – Another point that needs to be address is the estimated or proposed timeframe for construction and completion of the project. The Town of Ross has provided a timeframe of at least 12-months for closure of the fields for construction. Again, this is vastly different from the Memorial Park project timeframe– **completed in only 6-months** – that was nearly 2x in size with more, larger baseball fields.

That project began on September 6, 2022, and was completed by early-March. In fact, it was open in time for baseball and softball season, which typically begin the first or second week of March (with practices beginning a week to two weeks prior).

It is also worth noting that, according to the San Anselmo Town Council agenda packet dated June 28, 2022, the construction bid book indicated a project start date of September 6, 2022, and **asked for work to be completed within 90-working days from that date**. Although the timeline was not met, the Town of San Anselmo originally felt that a 90-working day completion was feasible and therefore made it part of the bid requirements.

I share this information as a nearby example of how another Marin County community addressed athletic field deterioration through targeted improvements to field infrastructure while maintaining balanced public access to the park. As the Town of Ross continues discussions regarding the long-term condition and usability of the grass turf and baseball fields at Ross Commons, the experience of Memorial Park Athletics Field Renovation provides a useful reference point. Renovations focused on drainage, irrigation, grading, and turf conditions can significantly improve field durability, safety, and usability for youth sports and the broader community. I respectfully encourage the Council to consider these types of infrastructure improvements as part of any future evaluation of Ross Commons so that this important community space can continue to serve Ross residents for many, many years to come.

1. **CALL TO ORDER:** 5:31 pm
2. **ROLL CALL:** Present: Cat Alexander, Ryan Lafrenz, Rod Kerr, Ivy Tzur, Dermott Corr, Patrick Stallone, Nate Marsh, Carolyn Morris  
  
Absent: Arlo Maury
3. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES – FEBRUARY 18, 2025:** Kerr motioned to approve the minutes; Lafrenz seconded; approved unanimously.
4. **OPEN TIME FOR PUBLIC EXPRESSION:** Ross Asselstine joined and presented about the heritage redwood tree roots being threatened by the planned excavation at Creek Park Plaza. He showed the Commissioners wood plate models of the planned work to highlight the area of concern, noting that the designers only consulted the tree people at the end after the design was set, and recommended that the Commissioners seek the best possible advice from an arborist before proceeding. He also raised concerns about contaminant soil on the property due to a leaking tank.
5. **PARKS UPDATE**  
  
**5A. Lansdale Park Equipment Assessment & Update:** Jerry Healy joined to present on the condition of Lansdale Park, indicating that overall the park is in good shape for its age, and people are passionate about this park; many who played there as children now bring their own kids. The Town has invested over \$30K into the park in the last year, and done work to make it ADA accessible, clean up broken/hazardous items, ensure no sharp edges, replace swings, prune trees, and install new garbage cans. There is some equipment nearing end-of-life, and the playhouse is 25-30 years old and faded, but overall the equipment is stable, and any replacements would be quite expensive and not necessary at this stage. Staff go through the park weekly and inspect all the equipment with a checklist to ensure ongoing safety, and additionally, a third-party inspector comes every three years. No recommended equipment upgrades at this time.
6. **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

**6A. 2025 Earth Day Volunteer Workday – Memorial Park:** Mattie O’Grady updated the Commissioners on the workday, which is confirmed for 4/26 from 9am-12:30, with the intention for this to become an annual event. San Anselmo Recreation staff will be there, and the San Anselmo Volunteer Effort charter has approved funds to purchase supplies/food for the volunteers. Staff are identifying projects that can be scaled up or down, including tree planting, cleaning/weeding the picnic area, a potential beautification project at the front of the Isabel Cook Community Center, and a potential painting project on the exterior of the Memorial Park restrooms. Staff will also train some of the commissioners on the volunteer software platform and will get promotional material out soon for the event.

Upon Kerr’s suggestion, staff will review with Public Works and explore doing an improvement project at the Elders’ Garden.

**6B. Review of Dog Use in Town Parks:** O’Grady reported that after consulting with the various stakeholders, the staff recommendation is to update the hours that dogs are allowed off-leash for consistency and clarity, but to not make any major overhauls at this time. The current Memorial Park rules allow dogs off-leash before 8am Monday-Friday, before 9am Saturday/Sunday, and one hour before sunset every day. Staff recommend amending this to allow dogs off-leash daily before 9am, and from 6-8pm. Staff additionally recommend creating and installing new signage around Memorial Park specifically for the dog rules, for both clarity and enforcement. No other changes are recommended at this time.

Staff will bring a mock-up of the proposed signage to the Commission for review before it is finalized; the goal is to have clear, friendly and concise signage that prioritizes the most important rules.

**Kerr motioned to approve amending the Memorial Park dog rules to allow dogs off-leash daily before 9:00am, and from 6:00-8:00pm, and to create and install new dog rules signage around Memorial Park. Lafrenz seconded the motion; unanimously approved.**

## **7. FINANCIAL REPORT**

**7A. Review Recreation Fund Report for period ending January 31, 2025:** As of February 28<sup>th</sup> 67% of the fiscal year has elapsed, and the Recreation Fund is listed at 80% of projected revenues and 60% of projected expenditures. This performance is reflective of the great work of the team, and the quality of the programs.

In light of the strong net revenue, O’Grady invited the Commissioners to bring any additional improvement projects for this year up for consideration, noting that the department will also want to review how much to set aside in capital funds for the next fiscal year.

O’Grady outlined the upcoming budget process: the department will review budget to actuals and work with each staff division to draft a proposed budget and this budget goes to Town Council for approval in June.

Finally, O’Grady shared that the new Events Coordinator Jamie Bristow has joined the Recreation Department team to manage Live on the Avenue and other events as well as marketing and social media.

**8. STAFF UPDATES**

**8A. Cervis Training:** Staff are finalizing the dates for a 1.5 hour training for selected Commissioners to learn the Cervis database management system, in preparation for the volunteer park clean-up event.

**8B. April 2<sup>nd</sup> – Parks & Rec General Plan Workshop:** This is the last in a series of workshops being held at the Robson-Harrington house, and is open to the public, with residents and merchants encouraged to attend. The goal is to learn what the community wants to help guide future conversations, and the Commissioners are invited to join as well. Invites will be emailed to them.

**8C. May 2<sup>nd</sup> – Spring Social for all Boards, Commissions, and Committees:** The Town is hosting this event on May 2<sup>nd</sup> from 6:30-8:30 to bring together the boards, commissioners, and committees. Each Commission will elect one person to give updates on what they are doing, and there will be a presentation on the history of the house, as well as a tour of the community garden.

**8D. Live on the Avenue – Production Update:** On the suggestion of the Town Council, staff explored options to hire a producer for Live on the Avenue, and secured a great producer. This person comes highly recommended, and brings a professional background on sound, technical aspects, and corporate events; he has a great track record of producing hundreds of free concerts a year for the City of San Francisco, and will provide a show manager for each night.

**9. COMMISSION COMMENTS & QUESTIONS, REQUEST FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:**

Alexander requested to add an agenda item to discuss the Chairs that were just appointed for the Subcommittees.

**RECOMMENDATION**

That Town Council take the following actions regarding the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project:

1. Approve the Plans, Specifications and Bid Book for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project and authorize staff to advertise for bids; and
2. Authorize the Town Manager to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

**BACKGROUND**

In 1924, the Town of San Anselmo acquired seven acres of land and built Recreation Park, which was later named Memorial Park. Baseball fields were installed, and in 1933 the American Legion and the Boy Scouts built the Log Cabin.

Over the years a playground, picnic areas, tennis courts, a community-based garden and most recently a skate park were added. Aside from the addition of the above listed amenities, the park has not received any significant renovations.

In 2018, the Town Council approved the Memorial Park Master Plan. The plan had been developed over an 18-month period and included a comprehensive community input process. In 2019, Measure M was placed on the ballot. Measure M called for a tax on each residential unit in San Anselmo for a term of 30 years. This tax would have funded the implementation of the master plan and provided ongoing maintenance funding for the park. Measure M was rejected by voters in November of 2019.

**DISCUSSION**

At the Council meeting on January 26, 2021 the Town Council authorized staff to go out to bid for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project. On April 13, 2021 bids were opened and Marina Landscaping was the low bidder at \$454,360. At the June 8, 2022 Council meeting, due to the ongoing drought, the Town Council voted to postpone the

project.

At the April 12, 2022, Town Council meeting, the Council authorized staff to prepare plans to replace the Memorial Park Athletic Field irrigation system and turf, to improve the existing wells, and to provide piping connections for a future large underground storage tank that may be used for well water, recycled water, gray water, and/or stormwater.

The attached Plans, Specifications and Bid Book for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project were developed based on the Council's direction (Attachment 1). Staff is seeking the Council's approval of the Plans, Specification and Bid Book and authorization to advertise for bids. Following the public bidding process, staff is also requesting that the Council authorize the Town Manager to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project engineer's estimate is \$800,000 for the base bid, and includes additional field subdrains, asphalt paving of the path near the restroom, well supply pipes, and future storage connection pipes. Funding for the Field Renovation Project would come from County Sales Tax for Parks funds (Measure A), which total approximately \$495,000, State Bond for Parks (Proposition 68) funds, which total \$178,000, and \$127,000 from Measure D.

### **GENERAL PLAN CONSISTENCY**

The project is consistent with the overarching General Plan Land Use goals of preserving San Anselmo's small town character and close connection to natural beauty of its surroundings.

### **CEQA AND CLIMATE ACTION PLAN CONSISTENCY**

The Town finds this project to be categorically exempt from the requirement for the preparation of environmental documents under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1, because it involves repair of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use. (14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15301). None of the exemptions listed in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 apply in this instance. Specifically, the project is not located in a sensitive environment, as the athletic fields are currently used year-round. In addition, this is an isolated restoration project that will not result in cumulative impacts. Finally, there are no unusual circumstances or historical resources impacted by the project.

The Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project will address San Anselmo's Climate Action Plan (CAP) 2030, specifically CAP Measure C-2, replace inefficient irrigation systems. The improvements to the walking and biking path will address CAP Measure T-2 (Bicycling) and T-3 (Walking).

### **CONCLUSION**

Memorial Park will turn 100 years old in 2026 and is in much need of repair. The replacement of the athletic fields is badly needed. Along with improvements to the existing wells, and provisions for future water sources, the field can be renovated even though the drought continues.

The recently completed Skatepark Rehabilitation Project and phase one of the Millennium Playground repair work, along with the future parking lot repair project continue the long-needed Memorial Park repair process.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

That Town Council consider the following decisions regarding the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project and associated work:

1. Accept the Marina Landscaping low bid, Attachment 1 bid results, in the amount of \$454,360 for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project, and authorize the Town Manager to execute the contract; and
2. Authorize the Town Manager to award to the lowest bidder the Memorial Park Parking Lot Pavement Repair Project.

## **BACKGROUND**

In 1924, the Town of San Anselmo acquired seven acres of land and built Recreation Park, which was later named Memorial Park. Baseball fields were installed, and in 1933 the American Legion and the Boy Scouts built the Log Cabin.

Over the years a playground, picnic areas, tennis courts, a community-based garden and most recently a skate park were added. Aside from the addition of the above listed amenities, the park has not received any significant renovations.

In 2018, the Town Council approved the Memorial Park Master Plan. The plan had been developed over an 18-month period and included a comprehensive community input process. In 2019, Measure M was placed on the ballot. Measure M called for a tax on each residential unit in San Anselmo for a term of 30 years. This tax would have funded the implementation of the master plan and provided ongoing maintenance funding for the park. Measure M was rejected by voters in November of 2019.

## **DISCUSSION**

### **Memorial Park Athletic Field**

At the Council meeting on January 26, 2011 Council authorized staff to go out to bid for the Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project. On April 13, 2021 bids were opened and

Marina Landscaping was the low bidder at \$454,360. Based on this bid, staff was preparing to recommend that Council award the bid to Marin Landscaping. However, in the past few weeks the Marin Municipal Water District (MMWD) has notified the public that Marin and Ross Valley are currently in one of the worst droughts since the 1976-77 drought. Due to the drought, MMWD is looking at requiring a mandatory 40% cut in water usage. With the drought in mind and the mandatory reduction in water usage, staff was prepared to recommend that the project be delayed.

Current average annual water usage based on the existing irrigation for the fields is approximately 2.75 million gallons a year with a summer average of 229,158 gallons a month, or approximately 7,640 gallons a day. The actual number of gallons of water used on any given day can vary from about 2,400 gallons in the winter/spring months to 15,400 per day in the summer.

However, to help alleviate the mandatory water reduction and to maintain the current field under drought conditions, Public Works is rehabilitating two existing water wells in Memorial Park and one in Creek Park. Based on pump tests, the wells at Memorial Park only provides about 5 gallons per minute or 7,200 gallons per day, which can more than handle the water usage during the winter/spring months but is less than 50% of the summer usage (assuming the rate is sustainable on a long-term basis, which is unknown at this time). Therefore, while well water may help augment the current water supply, it is only a partial solution if the drought continues.

The Creek Park well has a very high yield based on historical data and should be able to supply Creek Park with all of its irrigation needs. MMWD may allow the Town a variance for Memorial Park based on the reduced water usage at Creek Park. In addition to the water savings from the use of Town wells, a new irrigation system may also reduce the use of domestic water substantially. Water saving estimates from both the field designer, Abey/Arnold, and the low bidding contractor, Marina Landscaping, range from 30-40%.

Staff has also begun to look at rain harvesting as a third option to reduce the use of domestic water supply. Rain harvesting can take many forms from collecting street stormwater runoff in underground tanks, to above ground tank collection from Town buildings or other nearby roofs adjacent to Memorial Park. Based on a preliminary assessment, rain harvesting looks like it could be promising in combination with water wells and a new irrigation system.

The alternative for rain harvesting from roofs looks to be a simpler and more affordable option in terms of storage and the need for cleaning it as opposed to stormwater runoff from streets. If irrigation saves water on a daily basis, then rain harvesting could be used for the wetter winter/spring months which would help save well water for the dryer summer/fall months. The total actual reduction in domestic water usage could vary widely based on many factors but staff believes there could easily be an annual reduction in water usage of 50% or more.

If Council approves the Field Renovation Project, it is tentatively scheduled to start late summer. Between now and the project start date, staff would continue working on a rain harvesting system design and may incorporate this with the Field Renovation Project or may go back out to bid as a phase 2 project depending on ultimate design and park impact. Staff is estimating the cost for rain harvesting to be approximately \$150,000 including design and construction.

Adding this cost to the current low bid of \$454,360 equals \$604,360 which is still under the original engineers estimate of \$675,00 and leaves about a 10% contingency for unknown issues.

While the combined measures to reduce water consumption look very promising, there are many unknowns that staff cannot account for. MMWD has informed the Town that if this coming winter rains as little as the past one, there would only be enough water for three quarters of next year. The water rationing required could become severe and where water would come from the Town currently does not know. If it were determined that all irrigation had to cease for the Memorial Field, the cost to replace the fields could be \$150,000-\$200,000 or more. Staff believes the decision to move forward with the project should seriously take into account the current crisis we are in and the unknowns moving forward.

### **Memorial Park Pathway Project and Drainage Work**

Whether the Field Renovation Project moves forward or not, there are other park improvements that staff can implement. Concrete drainage repairs that were planned prior to the field renovation can be constructed to prepare for the field renovation this or next summer (assuming the drought ends). In addition, staff is planning to proceed with the Memorial Park Pathway Project, which connects the parking lot by the Log Cabin to Sunnyhills Drive. The current path is narrow, failing and is not Americans with Disability Act (ADA) compliant. The new path will be ADA compliant, and widened to 10 feet which will allow for both pedestrian and bicyclist use.

### **Memorial Park Parking Lot Project**

In addition to the above work, staff would also like to proceed with the repair of the main Memorial Park parking lot at Veteran's Place. The paving is failing and is in dire need of repair. In addition, bioretention would be installed as phase 2 of the project (most likely installed when the fields are done). The engineer's estimate to repair the parking lot is approximately \$150,000 and includes design, paving, drainage, and ADA compliant parking. Funding to repair the parking lot would come from remaining Measure D funds from this fiscal year. If authorized by Council, staff would proceed with an informal bid process and then award to the lowest bidder.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The drainage repair work in Memorial would be completed under force account and would come from the Unprogrammed Drainage Fund and is estimated to be about \$20,000. The Pathway Repair Project engineer's estimate is approximately \$50,000 and would be completed under force account with Measure D funds. The Parking Lot Repair Project engineer's estimate is \$150,000 and would be funded by Measure D funds if the project is approved by Council. The Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project without rain harvesting is \$454,360 and with rain harvesting is approximately \$604,360. Funding for the Field Renovation Project would come from County Sales Tax for Parks funds (Measure A) which total approximately \$450,000 and State Bond for Parks (Proposition 68) funds which total \$178,000. The two sources total \$628,000.

### **CONCLUSION**

Memorial Park will turn 100 years old in 2026 and is in much need of repair. The replacement of the athletic fields is badly needed but given the current drought situation replacement needs to be


carefully considered even with all of the potential water savings. Recently completed are the Skatepark Rehabilitation Project and phase one of the Millennium Playground repair work, so the repair process in the park has commenced. In addition, the drainage work above and the pathway repair project will continue the long needed Memorial Park repair process. If authorized by Council, the parking lot pavement repair project will make a huge difference in user safety and ADA compliance as well as user experience at this wonderful park.

**CEQA AND CONSISTENCY WITH CLIMATE ACTION PLAN 2030**

The Town finds this project to be categorically exempt from the requirement for the preparation of environmental documents under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1, because it involves repair of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use. (14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15301).

The Memorial Park Athletic Field Renovation Project, when completed, will address San Anselmo's Climate Action Plan (CAP) 2030, specifically CAP Measure C-2, replace inefficient irrigation systems. The improvement of the walking and biking path will address CAP Measure T-2 (Bicycling) and T-3 (Walking). The parking lot repair incorporating bioretention will address CAP Measure A-3 (Eco-friendly Development).
